COVID 19 UPDATE- Current advice from the Victorian Government

COVID-19 isolation requirements have changed

Any student or staff member who tests positive to COVID-19 **must now isolate for a minimum of 5 days instead of 7**. If asymptomatic, they may return to school on day 6. If they are symptomatic, they must remain in isolation until day 7. If they have symptoms after 7 days, they are strongly advised to stay home until their symptoms have resolved.

As an additional risk mitigation, the Department of Health strongly recommends that those leaving isolation wear a face mask when away from home, both indoors and outdoors, and when they cannot physically distance. Those leaving isolation on day 6 should wear a mask for 5 days but particularly the first 2 days. Those leaving isolation on day 7 should wear a mask for 4 days but particularly the first 2 days.

Those leaving isolation should consider taking a rapid antigen test before attending school.

Rapid antigen tests

Further deliveries of rapid antigen tests (RATs) to schools will continue in term 4. Ensure you utilise the (RATs) if you are symptomatic or a household contact.

Face masks

It is strongly recommended by the Victorian Department of Health that face masks are worn in indoor settings, with face masks mandatory for those aged 8 and over who are household contacts and attending school. This is because the wearing of masks is effective in reducing the transmission of COVID-19. It is the department's expectation that, through to the end of winter, students aged 8 and over and staff will wear masks when in class, except where removing a mask is necessary for clear communication or when a particular activity requires the removal of a mask.

Masks are not required to be worn outdoors but can be worn when physical distancing is not possible.

Expanded eligibility for fourth COVID-19 vaccine dose

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) has updated its recommendations around fourth doses of COVID-19 vaccination.

From Monday 11 July 2022, people aged over 30 will be eligible for a fourth dose.

ATAGI recommends that people aged 50 to 64 should have their fourth dose, while those aged 30 to 49 can choose to have a fourth dose. For further information, refer to the ATAGI website.

The survey results will be reported back to our school at the end of September.

SPOTLIGHT ON THE CASEA PROGRAM

THE CASEA FOCUS FOR THIS WEEK IS: Being Assertive: The cool, weak and aggro way!

Dear Parents and Guardians,

This week we will be looking at being assertive in managing emotions and conflicts. There are three basic ways children may respond but the most appropriate response is an assertive one. We call this the **COOL WAY!**

An Assertive Response (COOL WAY) to problem solving usually involves people standing up for themselves in a firm but friendly way. People who are assertive:

- use STOP, THINK and DO when problem solving
- stand tall and look the person in the eyes
- smile and look calm
- feel happy, confident, in control and happy about themselves

A Passive Response (WEAK WAY) is more likely when children lack confidence

in their ability to deal with a problem. They become fearful and let others give them

a hard time or agree to things they really don't want to do. Passive responses

result in a loss of self-respect and respect from others and problems are not

solved successfully.

An Aggressive Response (AGGRO WAY) tends to escalate the conflict and often results in injury or property damage and loss of self-esteem. Being aggressive involves reacting with any of the following behaviors:

- hitting, punching, tripping
- using insults and put-downs
- shouting and yelling
- damaging property

Remember an ASSERTIVE RESPONSE keeps you calm and helps you solve problems effectively.

THE CASEA FOCUS FOR THIS WEEK IS: Working Together!

Dear Parents and Guardians,

This week we will be looking at working together cooperatively and learning how to negotiate when disagreements happen.

It is important for children to understand that when people are working together, not everyone is going to agree because people will have different ideas and opinions.

Most students have the ability to cooperate but have some difficulty when it comes to negotiating solutions to disagreements. Being able to negotiate and cooperate means that disagreements don't need to turn into bigger, less manageable problems.

When attempting to resolve disagreements and problems, it is important for students to consider their own needs and wants, as well as the needs and wants of other students.

This involves allowing each person involved the chance to voice their concerns without interruptions. It also involves suggesting possible solutions to the problem in a 'COOL WAY', using a firm but friendly voice, standing tall and making eye contact.

One of the most crucial steps for students to learn is to listen to the suggestions of the other people involved. Students then decide which solution is the best but it should be one where everyone involved is pleased with the outcome.

There are five steps involved when students work together to negotiate an outcome that is fair for everyone.

- 1. Say what you want.
- 2. Listen to what the other person wants.
- 3. Think of some ways that you can both get what you want.
- 4. Remember that you don't always get everything you want.
- 5. Compromise and pick the one fair way where you both get some of what you want.

New Child Safe Standards

The new Child Safe Standards came into effect on 1 July 2022. Monmia has updated child safety strategies, policies, and practices by 1 July and have complied with the new standards.

Ministerial Order 1359 provides the framework for child safety in schools. As you look around the school you will see lots of evidence of our Child Safe Practices that are explained below.

Culturally safe environments guidance

Child Safe Standard 1:

• Establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued.

Child safety and wellbeing guidance

Child Safe Standard 2:

• Ensure that child safety and wellbeing are embedded in school leadership, governance and culture.

Child and student empowerment guidance

Child Safe Standard 3:

• Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.

Family engagement guidance

Child Safe Standard 4:

• Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.

Diversity and equity guidance

Child Safe Standard 5:

• Equity is upheld and diverse needs are respected in policy and practice.

Suitable staff and volunteers guidance

Child Safe Standard 6:

• People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.

Complaints processes guidance

Child Safe Standard 7:

• Ensure that processes for complaints and concerns are child focused.

Child safety knowledge, skills and awareness guidance

Child Safe Standard 8:

• Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.

Child safety in physical and online environments guidance

Child Safe Standard 9:

• Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.

Review of child safety practices guidance

Child Safe Standard 10:

• Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved.

Implementation of child safety practices guidance Child Safe Standard 11:

• Policies and procedures that document how schools are safe for children, young people and students.



Child Safety is everyone's responsibility.
