WE WANT OUR PARENTS / GUARDIANS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / guardians think of our school. The Parent / Guardian Opinion Survey is an <u>annual</u> survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. The survey is optional, but we <u>encourage all families</u> who have been randomly selected to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

A random sample of approximately 30 per cent of parents / guardians has been selected to participate in this year's survey.

The Parent / Guardian Opinion Survey will be open from Monday 7 August to Friday 8 September 2023.

The survey will need to be completed online, which will take **20 minutes** to complete. The survey can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on a desktop computer, laptop, tablet, or smartphone. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese. Our Schools survey results will be communicated to parents / guardians through the annual reporting process. Last year we used the survey results to plan student learning and wellbeing programs that align closely to the schools strategic plan.

THE SCHOOL-WIDE FOCUS: PROBLEM SOLVING 2

Dear Parents and Guardians,

It is important to help students learn a range of problem-solving skills through applied learning tasks so they are able to cope with the challenges they will face in the future. Problem solving is identified by the World Health Organisation as a key skill for health. To be able to solve problems, children need to be able to think critically and evaluate the consequences of various actions.

This week the students will learn to recognise there are many ways to solve conflict. Students will describe similarities and differences in points of view between themselves and people in their communities. Students will identify cooperative behaviours in a range of group activities. Students will practise individual and group decision-making and will practise solving simple interpersonal problems.

Family Activity

As a family, problem solve this scenario thinking of all family member's viewpoints.

'Our family is going out for dinner. One family member would like to eat Italian food, another Asian and another would like fish and chips. One member is happy to eat any cuisine. How will the family solve this problem?

THE SCHOOL-WIDE FOCUS: CASEA BEING ASSERTIVE: COOL, WEAK, AGRO

Dear Parents and Guardians,

This week we will be looking at being assertive in managing emotions and conflicts. There are three basic ways children may respond but the most appropriate response is an assertive one. We call this the **COOL WAY!**

An Assertive Response (COOL WAY) to problem solving usually involves people standing up for themselves in a firm but friendly way. People who are assertive:

- use STOP, THINK and DO when problem solving
- stand tall and look the person in the eyes
- smile and look calm
- · feel happy, confident, in control and happy about themselves

A Passive Response (WEAK WAY) is more likely when children lack confidence in their ability to deal with a problem. They become fearful and let others give them a hard time or agree to things they really don't want to do. Passive responses result in a loss of self-respect and respect from others and problems are not solved successfully.

An Aggressive Response (AGGRO WAY) tends to escalate the conflict and often results in injury or property damage and loss of self-esteem. Being aggressive involves reacting with any of the following behaviors:

- hitting, punching, tripping
- using insults and put-downs
- shouting and yelling
- damaging property

Remember an ASSERTIVE RESPONSE keeps you calm and helps you solve problems effectively.

ARTICLE 5: COMMON PHILOSOPHY AND PURPOSE

Dear Parents and Guardians.

We are very excited that Monmia PS is commencing the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) adventure in 2023.

The Monmia PS staff have been continuing to learn about the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Framework. As a staff we have been unpacking Module 1: Common Philosophy and Purpose. As a staff we have learnt the following and will use this information to formulate the Behaviour Statement of Purpose:

- Modern education must include a balanced focus on both academic achievement and social competency.
- We must not assume students know the behaviours and social skills that lead to success at school and in life.
- Behaviour is learned, therefore responsible behaviour can be taught using the same strategies
 used to teach literacy and numeracy.
- For behaviour change to occur, we must use positive approaches that strengthen teacherstudent relationships.
- Maintaining high expectations does not require 'get tough' or punitive approaches.
- We all 'own' each and every student and are jointly committed to their success.
- All staff must work together, striving for consensus on procedures and consistent implementation.

The next step of our journey is to revisit the school values so they align with the expected behaviours in all contexts. Look out for the survey so you can have your say.




Our school will appear in 'Nearby Locations' if you're within 10kms of the school, or search for our school by name.
