SCHOOL REVIEW

On Wednesday, this week we had Day 1 of our School Review, Validation Day. The review panel consisted of the Accredited Reviewer, the Senior Education Improvement Leader (SEIL) from Regional Office, two principals from other schools who are our challenge partners, Briany Kalms, School Council Vice President, Kate Belovitch, Merryn Auld, Lucia Vorpasso, Vineta Mitrevski and me. We observed classrooms and met with students to gather information about our school to align with our school data. We received positive affirmations, and our students were confident and knowledgeable in their responses. Next week we have two more days, a Fieldwork Day and the Final Panel Day. During the Fieldwork Day, the Reviewer, the SEIL and the two challenge partners will interview parents/guardians/carers, teachers, Education Support Staff and students. The information will be collated and help the panel to develop new goals, targets and key improvement strategies for the Strategic Plan for 2023 to 2026. We would love to have some volunteers be willing to be interviewed. Please contact the office if you would like to be interviewed as we would love your feedback.

As part of the School Review process Monmia Primary School has had the opportunity to review and update school policies that are linked to child safety and teaching and learning. All policies have gone through a consultation process and endorsed by the school principal alongside the school council.

COVID 19 UPDATE- Current advice from the Victorian Government

Please note the following important information in relation to changed COVID-19 settings.

COVID-19 isolation requirements have changed

The Victorian Government has announced the end of the Pandemic Declaration and associated Pandemic Orders. The following settings, based on advice from the Department of Health, will apply from 11.59pm Wednesday 12 October 2022.

It is strongly recommended that **students**:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days
- should not attend school after 5 days if still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school
- advise the school of the COVID-19 positive test result

Where **students** become symptomatic at school they should:

- be collected by their parents/guardians/carers
- undergo testing for COVID-19

The survey is to be completed **online**, taking approximately **20 minutes** to complete. The survey can be accessed at any convenient time on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones.

We are expecting every family to complete the survey so that the response rate is recorded and reflected in our overall school data.

Every family who completes the parent opinion survey will go in a draw to win a Hoyts movie voucher. The lucky winner will be drawn and announced at a whole school assembly.

The survey results will be reported back to our school at the end of September.

THE FOCUS FOR THIS WEEK IS: STAR to help achieve goals

Dear Parents and Guardians,

It is important to have goals because when you achieve a goal you feel happier and more successful. The **STAR** statements help you to remember the important messages about achieving your goals and achieving success.

Stick with it and don't give up.

 $m{T}$ hink about yourself. What are you good at? How do you know?

 $oldsymbol{A}$ lways make a plan.

 $oldsymbol{R}$ emember to try hard, work hard and have a go.

S – Stick with it and don't give up.

When something is hard to do, keep on trying at it. Stick to your plan and don't give up. If things get in the way, find another way to solve the problem or try something new. Mistakes help you to learn. All mistakes are useful because you can learn from them, even if you don't feel too happy when you make them.

T – Think about yourself. What are you good at? How do you know?

Using your strengths help you to achieve your goals. Your strengths can be personal strengths, such as being kind and brave or ability based strengths such as being good at something. No one is good at everything but you need to know what you are best at. Remember that some things may seem hard when you first try but as you get older and keep working at something, you get better.

A - Always make a plan.

To achieve your goals, you need to make a plan before you start. A plan helps you decide the best ways to do things and can change if it is not helping you with your goals.

R- Remember to try hard, work hard and have a go.

Even if something is hard to do, take a responsible risk and try to do it again and give it your best try. You can't be successful if you don't try. It is also important to understand that even if you try really hard, you aren't always successful. If you have a problem, don't give up but look at different ways to solve the problem.

THE FOCUS FOR THIS WEEK IS: LOOKING ON THE BRIGHT SIDE

Dear Parents and Guardians,

What kind of thinker are you?



Do you mainly see the glass half full or do you mainly see the glass half empty?

It is good to look on the bright side of things and see the glass half full.

Looking on the bright side means that you are positive and expect that things will work out well. It means that you think good things can happen so you try harder and do not give up easily. It also means that you appreciate all the good things in your life and not focus on the negative things.

Be a positive tracker and look for the good things.

A positive tracker is someone who always tries to look for the good things in themselves, in others and in what happens in their life. Positive trackers have happier lives and happier feelings. They tend to cope better with negative experiences in their lives. They are more fun to be with and people like them more and want to be their friend. They usually smile and laugh and love saying "I CAN"!

A positive tracker is also called 'OPTIMISTIC'!

Some children tend to be naturally optimistic and persistent in the face of obstacles. Others are more sensitive to setbacks and prone to taking things badly. However, you can learn how to be optimistic. Here are some tips:

- Children learn from observing others. If you express optimism, perseverance and resilience in the face
 of day to day obstacles, children around you will learn by example. If you notice that you tend towards
 pessimism, start working on your own thinking. It will pay off for everyone around you.
- Children learn through stories. When children are confronted with a difficult situation in their lives, you
 can tell stories from your own life that emphasizes how you got through a hard time or succeeded
 despite an initial failure.

There is no safe number of days for missing school. Each day a student misses school puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes. Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Mobile Phone Policy Student Use Only

Monmia Primary School



This policy was last presented to School Council in: October, 2022 School Council President: Amanda Deakin

Rationale

The Victorian Government takes the safe and responsible use of digital technologies, student safety and wellbeing and the development of social skills and positive behaviour, very seriously. On this basis, the Honorable James Merlino MP, Minister for Education, announced that a new mobile phone policy would take effect from Term 1 2020, and it is every school's duty to implement the policy.

Aim

Explain to the school community the Department of Education and Training and Monmia Primary School's policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile phones and other personal such as mobile devices and smart watches whilst at school.

Implementation

Students who bring mobile phones, a personal mobile device, including a smart watch must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours.

Students must:

- Hand in to the office their personal mobile phone and smart watch upon arrival to school and place it in a labelled sealed bag.
- Sign in their mobile phone and smart watch and sign out their mobile phone and smart watch at the end of the school day.

Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones Policy</u> issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones, will not be used during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted by the Principal.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

Secure storage

- Students are not encouraged to bring a mobile phone and other personal mobile devices to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so.
- Mobile phones owned by students are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/guardian's) risk.
- The School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft.
 Students and their parents/guardians are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items refer to the Department's Personal Goods policy.
- Students are required to store their mobile phones and smart watches in the school
 office for storage which is not accessible by unauthorised persons and is secure.

Enforcement

Students who refuse to hand over their personal mobile phone or smart watch will be
be given a consequence which aligns to the school's behavioural management
process will include time out or suspension. Parents/Guardians will be notified
immediately and asked to pick up their child's mobile phone or smart watch.

 Students who use their personal mobile phone or smart watch inappropriately at the school will be issued with consequences consistent with the school's existing student engagement policies.

Inappropriate use can be classified as:

- · disrupting the learning of others in any way
- · sending inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls
- · engaging in inappropriate use of social media, including cyber bullying
- taking video or images of people, including students, staff and members of the school community without their permission
- · taking video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, and gyms
- · uploading images of students without permission or parent/guardian consent

Exceptions may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically:

 Health and wellbeing-related exceptions can be granted by the principal, or by the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones Policy</u>.

The two categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's Mobile Phones Policy are:

1. Learning-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation	
For specific learning activities (class-based exception)	Unit of work, learning sequence	
For students for whom a reasonable adjustment to a learning program is needed because of a disability or learning difficulty	Individual Learning Plan	

2. Health and wellbeing-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation	
Students with a health condition	Student Health Support Plan	

Where an exception is granted, the student can only use the mobile phone for the purpose for which it was granted.

Camps, excursions and extracurricular activities

Personal mobile phones smart watches cannot be brought to camps, excursions, special activities unless an exception has been granted or there has been a specific request by teachers for learning purposes.

Exclusions

This policy does not apply to

- Out-of-School-Hours Care (OSHC)
- Out-of-school-hours events
- Travelling to and from school
- · iPads and all other personal devices

Evaluation

This policy will be reviewed as part of the School Council cyclic review or earlier if required.




Introducing...


Monmia's Annual Multicultural Lunch
